Mark Dennis, our Chapter webmaster and I are about to begin a chapter initiative to add and update the list of pipe/digital organs that are currently on the Lehigh Valley Chapter website (www.lvago.org) and to enter the pipe organs in the Organ Historical Society Database website (<http://organsociety.bsc.edu>). The OHS website contains a searchable database of pipe organs in the U.S. The database seeks to provide information on pipe organs that exist or have existed in the U.S., pipe organs that have been built in the U.S. and are installed within its boundaries or in other locations and pipe organs built by Canadian builders.

Our goal is the following:

- List as many pipe/digital organs as possible on the lvago.org website
- Add pictures of all the churches and organs on the lvago.org website
- Enter the pipe organs of the Lehigh Valley on the OHS Database

Here is where you all can help. If you go to the lvago.org website, you can click on “Lehigh Valley Organs” at the bottom of the website. If your church organ is not listed there, send us the specification via e-mail (and picture if possible) and we will take care of the rest. If you would like to enter information about your pipe organ on the OHS Database, it is easy to use. Log into the OHS website and follow the instructions for adding your organ’s information. For those who don’t have e-mail access, you may take advantage of the US Postal Service and send your information to Mark.
